Rome, June 1 - 8, 2024

Our religion depends on a living faith. To keep our faith alive, we need to ever renew, refresh and re-live the awesomeness of the Magnalia Dei, the magnificent works of God Psalm 130: "Praise the Lord, O my soul, and do not forget all His benefits" (Ps 103). St. Paul: "Therefore brethren, stand fast and hold the traditions which you have learned, whether by word or by our letters." (Thess. 2:15)

We will read and discuss selected writings of the Church Fathers on central mysteries of our faith and explore the treasures of sacred art. Thereby we will enliven our faith, rediscover our identity in Christ, appreciate the historicity of our Church, and be newly empowered as disciples to draw others to Christ: "You are the light of the world." We look forward to an enlightening and inspiring week.

Here are highlights of our planned program:

Rev. Prof. John Wauck, professor of Literature and Communication of the Faith at the Università della Santa Croce. He will discuss the cultural challenges of atheism today, and the uses of literature for apologetics. He will also be our Chaplain and our Host.

<u>Prof. James Papandrea</u>, Catholic professor of Church History and Theology at the Garrett-Evangelical Theological seminar at Northwestern University. Also a singer and song writer! His CD: "Still Quiet Voice." He will speak on the Holy Trinity in the writings of the early Church Fathers, drawing from his book, "Trinity 101.".

<u>Rev. Prof. Paul O'Callaghan</u>, professor of Theological Anthropology at the Università della Santa Croce. Speaking on the wonders of the Incarnation of the Son of God and our Redemption and new life in Christ.

<u>Prof. Jeffrey Morrow</u>, Senior Fellow at the St. Paul Center for Biblical Theology, Franciscan University. He will speak on the wonders of the Holy Eucharist and Confession.

<u>Prof. Ralf van Buhren</u>, a professor of Theology, Church History, and Sacred Art at Santa Croce. He will conduct meditative tours of the treasures of sacred art and architecture in Rome and Florence, including the Vatican Museum and the Sistine Chapel.
